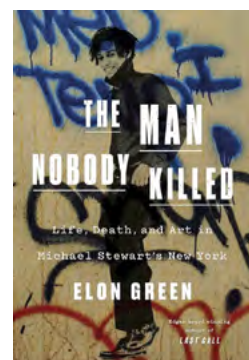

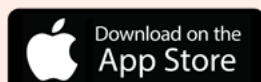

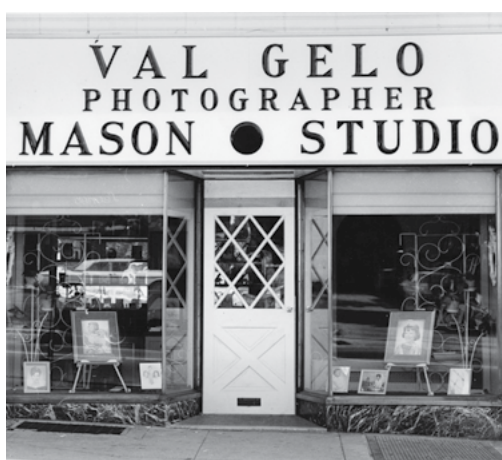

Mason on Main: A Photographic History of Mason Studio 1920-1985

This new local history exhibit, now on view in the Columns Gallery, highlights over 70 years of photography produced by Mason Studio, formerly located at 118 Main Street in Port Washington. Following its 1985 closure, the Library acquired approximately 20,000 photographs taken throughout Mason Studio's many years in business. These photos are snapshots of life in Port Washington from the 1920s through the 1970s and include individuals, buildings, businesses, and events. *Funded by the Friends of the Library.*

History Center Spotlight

What better way to beat the summer heat in Port Washington than to cool off in the waters of Manhasset Bay? At the turn of the century, Ryder's Bathing Beach was the spot to do just that. Located on Main Street at the foot of Second Avenue, Ryder's Beach featured a dock, swim ladder, cabanas for changing, and a rowboat rental pier.

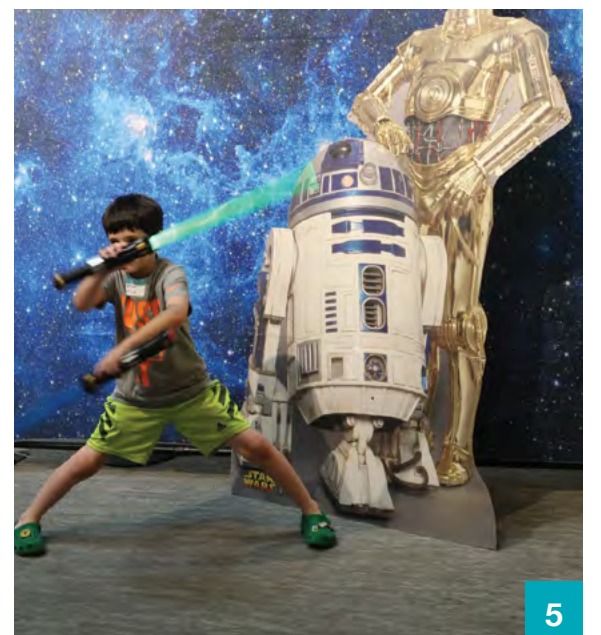

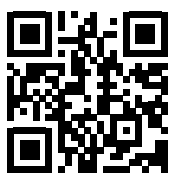

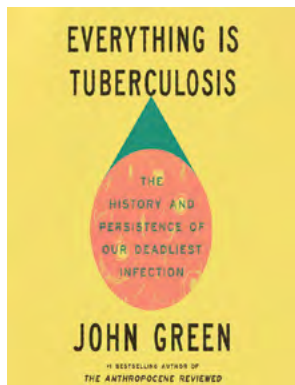
