History Center Spotlight

At the turn of the 20th century, Manorhaven was largely undeveloped save for Locust Grove, a waterfront park featuring a large dock, a grand pavilion, a picnic area, and treelined avenues perfect for strolling on hot afternoons. In the summer months, steam-powered paddlewheel excursion boats like the one pictured here would sail to the Grove carrying day-tripping city-dwellers hoping to find some relief from the urban heat in the cool breezes off Manhasset Bay.






