## Vaccine Spotlight: Thank You Roberta Cooperman!

According to ESOL Coordinator Peggy O’Hanlon, PWPL patron Roberta Cooperman is “like an angel.” Ms. Cooperman was able to acquire more than 100 vaccine appointments for our ESOL students and their families during a time when vaccines were in limited supply. Beginning in February 2021, Cooperman reached out to Libraries, elder care facilities, restaurants, and other North Shore institutions offering her help. She states, “I was like Rosie the Riveter making weapons, and my weapons were the vaccines.” In total, Roberta has helped Long Islanders book more than 600 appointments. 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## Original Library Clock from Belleview Avenue Makes its Way to Library Drive

This Seth Thomas wall clock once hung over the Circulation Desk of PWPL’s Belleview Avenue building. The distinctive wooden clock with brass hands and numerals was a characteristic feature of the Belleview Avenue Library for at least two decades. When PWPL moved to its present Library Drive location in 1970, the clock was offered to Library staff member Loretta “Lori” Brower, who kept it in her possession for many years. In the early 1990s, the timepiece was inherited by her stepson, Robert B. Smith. Smith took excellent care of the clock over the years, replacing the motor in 1997 and having the motor entirely rebuilt in early 2021, ensuring that the clock keeps time as smoothly as it did when it hung in the Belleview Avenue Library. Smith always hoped to return the clock to its “rightful home” at PWPL, and this past July, he and his wife made a trip to Long Island to gift the clock to the History Center at the Port Washington Public Library. We thank him for his generous donation, and are thrilled to have this beautiful piece of Library history back in our collection!
